### That The World May Know: In the Dust of the Rabbi - Session 3: The Presence of God: A Counter-Cultural Community

# God Prepared a World to Receive His Message

The people of Asia Minor did not need more gods. They were happy and prosperous enough with their own gods. They were confident of eternal life, had no sense of sin, and felt no need for forgiveness. Yet when the early Christians brought the message of the kingdom of God and lived that message in the midst of a pagan world, the awesome power of God turned that world upside down.

 Somehow the early believers knew that Asia Minor was a strategic location to fulfill the Messiah's mandate. Scripture reveals that several disciples of Jesus went to Asia Minor. In which regions and cities of Asia did Paul teach?

#### **Culture Clash in the Marketplace**

One area in which the values of early Christians opposed those of the culture at large was in the making, buying, and selling of goods. In Asia Minor, every trade — from potters to farmers to sandal makers — had a guild, and every tradesperson belonged to a guild. Each guild had a god, and guild members celebrated and sacrificed to that god. In addition, everyone who had products to sell had to "dedicate" those goods to the honor of the gods of the city.

#### **Excluded From Political Power**

Jesus' disciples took their message to a world under Rome's authority, but daily life was governed on the local level by town councils meeting in the *bouleuterion*, or council house. His disciples would be excluded from that important leadership council. The councils were powerless to silence the disciples or diminish the power of their message.

1. What had Jesus warned His disciples concerning their relationship with unbelievers and their governments? How did this prepare them, especially those who were Zealots?

#### **Communities of Faith**

Throughout Scripture God accomplishes His work with individuals in the context of community. Individual actions affected the community. God's work within the community affected individuals and the community affected the world around it. The Christian commitment to live in obedience to God, as practiced in hundreds of small house churches across the Roman Empire caused the early church to explode.

 Where did Jesus live with His disciples when they were training to become like Him? How did this housing situation affect the disciples' obedience to the Rabbi's teaching?
